## School Organisation

Dear Parents / Guardians,

Week 5 has been a productive and enjoyable week for the majority of students, with a bit of fun Tuesday for the Melbourne Cup and lots of work continuing in classes to ensure children are progressing well with their literacy, numeracy etc.

### MELBOURNE CUP

Tuesday's Melbourne Cup Day may have been a little different to normal years, but we're proud to say the day ran really well and the children enjoyed being able to dress up, compete in races and fashion parades etc. Each class took different approaches to the fashions and hats, with most classes generally sharing amongst classmates and within classrooms, however, our First Steps and Junior Unit were able to separate classes and do a mini parade outside. Many children still dressed up, we loved seeing some wonderful hats... and the races were good fun! Egg and spoon, sack races and long distance races were all in order... with many children going home with a ribbon or even a medallion! It was sad without all of our parents, grandparents, family members etc present... however, feel pleased that we were able to run the day in a reduced form for the children. Certainly not the same as our big and bold normal years, but overall... a COVID SAFE and fun day had by all. A huge thank you to Renae Westley for her organisation of the day and our staff for ensuring things ran smoothly with marshalling, supervising, organising etc.

### 2021 BOOKLISTS & PARENT PAYMENT POLICY

The 2021 Parent Payment Policy and Booklists are being sent home this week. Parents have the choice to purchase the stationery items (Pack A) from JI Office Products (the preferred supplier) or purchase all listed items elsewhere (must be exactly the same item please). If you are ordering elsewhere, you will need to pay the school directly for the Essential Education items in Part C. **Year 5 students:** if your child already has a dictionary, please use the Year 6 booklist to order online as this is exactly the same as Year 5 except it doesn't include the dictionary or earbuds. iPad charges - please note that students in the Senior Unit (which includes some Year 4's) have 1 to 1 access to an iPad for the entire year, (which means every student has their own iPad, not sharing as done in lower Year levels), hence the higher charge. Please also note we have reduced this charge considerably this coming year, in an effort to reduce the total cost for parents in consideration of COVID financial implications for families. If you have any questions or queries regarding the booklists of parent payments, please feel free to contact the Office.

### OPERATIONAL CHANGES FOR TERM 4 - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW...

By now, you would understand what is required of you to keep our children, our staff and yourselves safe. To ensure you are aware of all that is required, please note the following points:

- Adults (other than our staff) are not supposed to be on site during Term 4 – please ensure you drop your child/ren off at school and depart. Do not congregate outside school exit / entry points – social distance and ensure you wear a face mask. If you have to come on site, please ensure you do not enter buildings or linger long. Contact with teachers can occur over the phone, via email, Dojo, Webex etc,

- Children will be dismissed in a staggered way during Term 4 – Prep, Year 1/2's will be dismissed at 3:05pm (along with older siblings). Please be ready to pick children up at this earlier time. Years 3 – 6 will be dismissed at 3:15pm. The Ravenswood bus will depart earlier at 3:05pm, but will not leave children unattended at bus stops if arriving early and no adult is present. The Kangaroo Flat bus will run as normal – children will just stay on site with a yard duty teacher until the bus arrives,
- Whilst the Office is open, please follow social distancing regulations in the foyer by waiting outside until invited in, or when there are fewer than 2 families waiting. Instead of approaching the usual counter, a table has been set up in the foyer with a bell to attract attention,
- Our OSHC program will run normally each morning and afternoon – bookings made in the usual way through the Office / Janet Dean [Janet.Dean@education.vic.gov.au](mailto:Janet.Dean@education.vic.gov.au). Please email Janet your requirements for Term 4,
- Our school canteen is open and providing delicious lunches as normal, all within COVID-SAFE guidelines. Please order online – cashless payments only. Thank you,
- Our school crossing supervisor has returned to the Calder Highway crossing - so your children can walk home safely and cross the road securely with the guidance of Wendy, our Crossing Supervisor. Please welcome her back as you use the crossing,
- Drink bottles must be sent to school each day – we don't have bubble taps in operation due to COVID-19 concerns. If children do not come with a drink bottle, we endeavour to provide them with a plastic cup for the day,
- All children should be in full uniform – including wearing a hat in Term 4.

### **BUSHFIRE AND CODE RED DAYS**



Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life. Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed when a Code Red fire danger rating is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district.

**Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.**

Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days notice of a potential Code Red day closure by letter, the Big Hill PS website, Big Hill PS and P&F Facebook pages and on the Flexischools app. A Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1:00pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day. **Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast.** This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that: No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day. Out Of School Hours care will also be cancelled on these days. School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located. As a bus coordinating school all bus routes will be cancelled, ie: Ravenswood bus run. Depending on which Bureau of Meteorology district is impacted, other bus route (not coordinated by Big Hill PS) cancellations may affect our school eg: Kangaroo Flat bus.

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – **on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.** For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the CFA advise that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day. As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan, reprioritised any maintenance works that may assist in preparing for the threat of fire and cleared our facility's grounds and gutters.

**What can parents do?** Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed. Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, by checking our website [www.bighillps.vic.edu.au](http://www.bighillps.vic.edu.au) or Facebook pages and by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan. Most importantly at this time of year, if you're planning a holiday or short stay in the bush or in a coastal area, you should check warnings in advance of travel and remain vigilant during your stay. If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan. ### **FEELING SICK? FLU-LIKE SYMPTOMS?**

If your child reports to you that they have any flu-like symptoms, sore throat, runny nose, loss of smell or taste, cough, sneezing etc, then please leave them at home. By law, your child must not come to school if they are feeling unwell in any of the ways outlined. It can be a burden having to stay home with unwell children, but in current times, you will need to. For adults visiting the school for pick up etc, please ensure you stay off site if feeling unwell. To date, we have remained COVID free. Your support in ensuring this continues is greatly appreciated by keeping children home when you or your children are unwell.

## **FACE MASKS**

All adults attending on site, whether staff, parent or other have to wear a FITTED face mask under new Victorian law – this won't change in Term 4. Teachers and Education Support Officers can remove them when teaching or working directly with a child to instruct. Please ensure you have a mask on when out of your car, on site etc. Children do not have to wear masks in Primary Schools, even those who are 12. If your child prefers, they are more than welcome to wear one if they feel safer.

## **KINDER – PREP ENROLMENT**

If you have not enrolled your child for Prep, 2021... please contact the Office / Janet Dean as soon as possible. For parents wanting to organise a tour, we are unable to provide school tours currently due to COVID-19 restrictions. With some restrictions changing, we are now able to have up to 10 children visit at a time, but they cannot mix with other children and must stay in a designated area of the school with one of our teachers. We will be contacting Kinder parents to indicate a date and time for your child to come to school as part of transition.

## **MOVING AT THE START OF 2021 OR THE END OF 2020?**

It's quite common for families to move interstate or to other locations over summer. If you know this is happening for your child/ren, please advise the Office ASAP. This helps with planning for 2021.

## **STAFFING**

It's been wonderful to welcome Kate Dole back to her classroom this week. I know the students in the Senior Unit have been excited to see her ☺. Brett Strange takes sick leave as of today for at least the next 3 weeks – whilst we await Brett's return from surgery, we will ensure his class is supported by Leisha Morrison (and on the odd day, Zoe Wright). Jen Nicholls is also quite unwell... and will be absent for the next few weeks. We send our best wishes out to Jen and hope she makes a speedy recovery. During Jen's absence in Weeks 6 and 7, we welcome Jo Totta to the school for the majority of days. Nick Reid remains on Paternal Leave for next week also – with Alice Adams and Zoe Wright delivering Nick's program.

## **DAY FOR DANIEL – WHAT A SUCCESS!**

## **TRANSITIONS**

Year 7 transitions have stalled due to restrictions, however, if your child has PSD funding or extreme needs, parents can contact their 2021 school to organise additional COVID-SAFE visits. As outlined above, we will be welcoming new Prep (Kinder) students in groups of ten in the coming weeks. We have restrictions to follow, such as no adults, only one staff member permitted to work with the visitors... and remaining isolated from other groups of children at school. Whilst this will be operationally a challenge, we believe that one of our Prep teachers for 2021 will easily enjoy working with 10 students in our new multipurpose room when they do visit... and a tour of the school (outside) would also be in order!

## **CLASS STRUCTURE AND TEACHER PLACEMENT**

In 2021, we will be running the following structure: 3 Prep/Year 1 classes (First Steps), 2 Year 1/2 classes (Junior Unit), 1 Year 2/3 and 2 Year 3/4 classes (Middle Unit) and a Year 4/5 and 3 Year 5/6 classes (Senior Unit).

I can now announce that our First Steps Team for 2021 is Nicole Peach, Pauline Mulcair and Rhys Bull.

Our Junior Unit for 2021 is Catherine Kelley and Jen Nicholls.

In the Middle Unit for 2021, Wendy Hicks will teach Year 2/3, whilst Dean White and Renae Westley will teach the Year 3/4's. Finally, our Senior Unit consists of Brett Strange teaching Year 4/5 and Kate Dole, Ainsley Stanley and Lauren Adcock teaching Year 5/6.

Other staff, including specialists, have yet to be organised for 2021. This will be shared in the future. As for formation of the classes, we have started placing children into classes for 2021 taking into account the parent requests (which closed a few weeks ago – sorry...no late requests), student friendship groups, current teacher's opinion of academic, social, emotional and behavioural needs etc.

This will take some time to refine, with classes revealed on our WHOLE SCHOOL TRANSITION DAY scheduled for Tuesday, 8<sup>th</sup> December.

## DIGITAL WORLD TRAVEL

**Just, as we cannot guarantee risk free travel on the highways, the air, or by sea, we cannot guarantee 100% risk free travel in the ever-expanding Digital World.**

**However, we can try to help you limit the risks!**

Cyberbullying is the use of technology to harass, threaten, embarrass, or target another person. By definition, it occurs among young people.

When an adult is involved, it may meet the definition of **cyber-harassment** or **cyber-stalking**, a crime that can have legal consequences.

**How is it different to face-to-face bullying?**

While cyberbullying is similar to face-to-face bullying it also differs in the following ways:

- it can give the person doing the bullying a sense of being anonymous,
- it can occur 24/7 and be difficult to escape,
- it is invasive and you can be targeted while at home,
- it can have a large audience - sent to groups or posted on a public forum,
- it can be permanent.

## Kate's Safe Travel Tips

Bullies, mean girls and boys, have been around forever! However, new technologies have given them a whole new platform for their actions.

As adults, we're becoming more aware that the "sticks and stones" adage no longer holds true; both real world and online name – calling can have serious emotional consequences for our children and teens. Just like bullying in real life, there can be terrible lasting effects on those who experience cyberbullying. Fortunately, our growing awareness of cyberbullying is helping us all learn a lot more about how to prevent it.

**Being bullied can lower your self-esteem and you may feel alone, sad, angry and scared.**

If you are being bullied, it is not your fault and there is nothing wrong with you.

Don't be afraid to let someone know that you are being bullied, as they may be able to help you.

**How do I deal with it?**

- Don't retaliate or respond.
- Block the person doing the bullying and change your privacy settings.
- Report it - Click the report abuse button.
- Collect the evidence - keep mobile phone messages and print emails or social networking conversations.
- **Talk to someone you trust**, like a family member or friend.

Talking to your teachers or parents can make a difference!

## **TEACHER APPRECIATION DAY**


