Dear Parents / Guardians,

What a crazy Week 4 it has been, with Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday spent in STAGE 4 LOCKDOWN. A huge thank you to all (parents, staff and students) for stepping up to the challenge this week. It's a relief to have everyone back on deck today.

CURRENT COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS?

In a nutshell, please:

- Wear a mask when indoors or if you cannot social distance 1.5m,
- Hand sanitise on entry to the school grounds,
- Stay off site if unwell,
- Keep children at home if unwell – sore throat, runny nose, cough, fever/chills etc. Children at school who are unwell have to be sent home – please ensure your emergency contacts are up-to-date.

PREP WEDNESDAYS OFF – NEW DATE ADDED DUE TO LOCKDOWN

Preps have no school each Wednesday in February. Due to this week's Lockdown and all testing appointments for Preps on Wednesday, 17th February having to be postponed due to the LOCKDOWN, we need to allocate **Wednesday, 3rd March** as Prep free also to catch up on the students who missed out. It has to be done to ensure all Preps have been screened at the start of the year in Literacy and Numeracy as part of DET entry requirements. I apologise for any inconvenience. With some notice, families of Prep students can make plans for alternative care on Wednesday, 3rd March. Those who should have had an appointment yesterday will now have it next Wednesday, 24th March at the same time.

READING

Goal: 225 days of reading for the year! Is your child reading each night? If you don't know, please begin to monitor that your child is. Each night read should be recorded in either the student diary of reading diary (depending on what Unit your child is in).

REMOTE AND FLEXIBLE LEARNING

With Monday – Wednesday being REMOTE AND FLEXIBLE LEARNING, some Units sent materials home to families for children to use. If this was the case for your child/ren, please ensure all learning materials are returned to school. A big thank you to families, students and staff for making this short stint of remote learning productive. Fortunately, we are back on site and learning traditionally. Hopefully this continues – fingers and toes crossed!

YEAR 6 LEADERSHIP TRAINING

Tomorrow all Year 6 students will be trained in THE YOUNG LEADERS PROGRAM. Kate Dole and I will spend the day with our Year 6's in the multipurpose, setting them up with the skills of leadership for their final year of schooling. Training manuals and homework will come home with all Year 6 students. Please ensure you have a chat to your child (if they are in Year 6) about the training and what they have to do at home to model their LEADERSHIP skills.

SCHOOL COUNCIL – NEXT WEEK!

Our first School Council meeting for 2021 will be **next** Tuesday, 23rd February. Finance will meet at 6:00pm, before our February meeting at 6:30pm. Elections for School Council 2021 have commenced with information in the last few newsletters and below. For those that prefer, School Council will be offered in both Webex form and on site this year. Meeting invites will be sent closer to the date along with meeting materials. If coming on site this month, we will be meeting in the main building, in the new library space.

SCHOOL CAPTAINS

Many Year 6 students have taken a lot of time and effort to apply for our Leadership positions this year. Very soon, we will be able to announce who our male and female SCHOOL CAPTAIN and VICE SCHOOL CAPTAIN are. Traditionally we let the successful applicants and students know first before announcing it in the newsletter. Badges will be presented in the future at an assembly – date to be confirmed once badges have been organised.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL (FORMERLY KNOWN AS STUDENT VOICE)

SRC applications should have been trickling in over the last few weeks. These are to go to Cara Barnes, our Chaplain... who will make a decision based on discussions with staff. We have two SRC representatives from each class (Year 2 – 6). SRC meet two to three times a term with a focus on organising fundraisers, special events and to discuss ways to improve the school. This week would be the last chance to send in a letter to Cara, outlining why a child would like to be part of the SRC for 2021. SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS –

Information for parents from the Department of Education and Training (DET)

What is a school council and what does it do? All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad directions of a school in accordance with their constituting Order and the *Education and Training Reform Act 2006*. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Who is on the school council? For most primary school councils, there are three possible categories of membership: 1. A mandated elected Parent member category – more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. DET employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school. 2. A mandated elected DET employee member category – members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members. 3. An optional Community member category – members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be Community members. Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

Why is parent membership so important? Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help inform and shape the direction of the school. Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

Do I need special experience to be on school council? Each member brings their own valuable life skills and knowledge to the role. However, councillors may need to develop skills and acquire knowledge in areas that are unfamiliar to them. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

Code of conduct for school councillors - School councils in Victoria are public entities as defined by the *Public Administration Act 2004*. School councillors must abide by the *Code of Conduct – Employees* issued by the Victorian Public Sector Commission. The Code of Conduct is based on the Victorian public sector values and requires councillors to: **act with honesty and integrity** (be truthful, open and clear about their motives and declare any real, potential or perceived conflict of interest and duty), **act in good faith** in the best interests of the school (work cooperatively with other councillors and the school community, be reasonable, and make all decisions with the best interests of students foremost in their minds), **act fairly and impartially** (consider all relevant facts of an issue before making a decision, seek to have a balanced view, never give special treatment to a person or group and never act from self interest), **use information appropriately** (respect confidentiality and use information for the purpose for which it was made available), **exercise due care, diligence and skill** (accept responsibility for decisions and do what is best for the school), **use the position appropriately** (not use the position as a councillor to gain an advantage), **act in a financially responsible manner** (observe all the above principles when making financial decisions), **comply with relevant legislation and policies** (know what legislation and policies are relevant for which decisions and obey the law) AND **demonstrate leadership and stewardship** (set a good example, encourage a culture of accountability, manage risks effectively, exercise care and responsibility to keep the school strong and sustainable).

Indemnity for school council members: School councillors are indemnified against any liability in respect of any loss or damage suffered by the council or any other person in respect of anything necessarily or reasonably done, or omitted to be done by the councillor in good faith in: the exercise of a power or the performance of a function of a councillor, or the reasonable belief that the act or omission was in the exercise of a power or the performance of a function of a council. In other words, school councillors are not legally liable for any loss or damage suffered by council or others as a result of reasonable actions taken in good faith.

How can you become involved? The most obvious way is to vote in the school council elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant. In view of this, you might consider: standing for election as a member of the school council OR encouraging another person to stand for election.

What do you need to do to stand for election? The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for Nominations following the commencement of Term 1 each year (*It's included in today's newsletter as part of School Council Elections information*). All school council elections must be completed by the end of March unless the usual time line has been varied by the Minister. If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent member category (*forms available from the Office*). DET employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not engaged in work, are eligible to nominate for Parent membership of the school council at that school. Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt via post, email or by hand following the receipt of your completed nomination. If there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

Remember: Consider standing for election to school council this year. Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do. Be sure to vote in the elections – if we have more nominations than positions. Contact the Principal (Matt Pearce) for further information.

AN ELECTION IS TO BE CONDUCTED FOR MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COUNCIL OF BIG HILL PS

Nomination forms may be obtained from the Office and must be lodged by 3:15pm on Friday, 5th March 2021. If a ballot is required (depending on the number of nominations), this will close at 3:15pm on Friday, 12th March 2021.

Following the closing of nominations a list of the nominations received will be posted at the school. The terms of Office, membership categories and number of positions in each membership category open for election are as follows:

CAMPS, SPORT AND EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

DO YOU HAVE A CONCESSION CARD? WOULD YOU LIKE \$125 TO PAY FOR SCHOOL COSTS? MAKE SURE YOU READ THIS SECTION!

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their achievements. CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is: \$125 for primary school students and \$225 for secondary school students. Contact the school Office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the CSEF website. Parents/carers are reminded that all CSEF applications are due as soon as possible to enable funds to be used for excursions and camps. We can't apply for this on your behalf – so please make sure you put in an application if eligible. If you received CSEF funding in 2020 at Big Hill Primary School, you do not need to reapply. If you are unsure, please check.

STUDENT OF THE WEEK

Every week a student from each class is chosen as STUDENT OF THE WEEK, based on different criteria chosen by the teacher. Sometimes it might be for displaying one of our School Values. At other times it might be for demonstrating a special quality that has been the focus of work within the class for the previous week, or for displaying desirable work practices and attitudes during class. As part of our Thursday newsletter, STUDENTS OF THE WEEK will be announced. On Monday, a special certificate is handed to winners by their classroom teachers. FIRST STEPS NEWS

SCHOOL NURSE FORMS

All Prep students in Victoria are eligible for a free health assessment. Today, your child brought home a school nurse form in their reader bag. This form allows parents/carers to consent to this assessment and provide health information to the nurse that can be followed up if required. Please fill this out and return it to your classroom teacher by Tuesday, 9th March.

BUDDY PROGRAM

The buddy program involves pairing and older student with a younger student. Children in the First Steps Unit will take part in the Buddy Program with other students in the Senior Unit. The purpose of a buddy program is to support a smooth transition for children starting school. Schools report that the programs promote social and support networks for children beginning Prep and promote a sense of community and belonging in the school. Next week the Prep and Year 1 students in the First Steps Unit will be meeting their Year 5/6 buddy. They will participate in structured activities and outdoor play to build relationships.

PREP DROP OFF

If your child is happy and settled to enter the classroom independently please drop your child off at the door in the morning. This will limit the amount of adults in the classroom and helps to settle children into school. Some children feel anxious due to the large crowds in the classroom, teachers can also supervise children more effectively with less people in the room.

PREP WEDNESDAY DAYS OFF

Due to the COVID Lockdown the Prep Wednesday days off will be extended. Prep students will not be required at school on Wednesday, 24th February and also **Wednesday, 3rd March**.

SCHOOL ENTRY ASSESSMENT

If your child was booked in to participate in the School Entry Assessment yesterday, Wednesday, 17th February your child's time will now be rolled over to the following Wednesday 24th February at the same time. For example, if your child's time was Wednesday, 17th February at 9:00am it will now be Wednesday, 24th February at 9:00am.

CHILD CARE SUBSIDY NEWS

CONFIRM YOUR INCOME!

As part of Child Care Subsidy balancing, families need to confirm their income.

For the 2018–19 financial year families need to do this by 31 March 2021. The deadline has been extended from 30 June 2020 to 31 March 2021 because of COVID-19.

Services Australia is sending letters to families this week reminding them to confirm their 2018-2019 income.

Many families may be unfamiliar with this process.

If you don't confirm your income by 31 March 2021 your CCS will stop. This means you'll be charged full fees when you use OSHC.

If families confirm their income after 31 March, their CCS can start again but it won't be back paid.
