Dear Parents / Guardians,

As we move into the latter part of Week 2, our children are back into routines and working hard in classes across the school. Our Preps are now used to full time schooling and are enjoying all of the joys of being at primary school. Overall, it's been settled and productive at Big Hill PS overall.

CURRENT COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

The situation in Perth is a reminder that at any time things can change. With this in mind, here's the current restrictions in place for Term 2:

- Wear a mask when you can't social distance. Preference is to wear a mask in the Office, but you don't have to if there are no others in the foyer and you can social distance,
- Hand sanitise on entry to the school grounds,
- Stay off site if unwell,
- Keep children at home if unwell sore throat, runny nose, cough, fever/chills etc. Children at school who are unwell have to be sent home - please ensure your emergency contacts are up-to-date,
- If your child has a recurring illness with symptoms similar to COVID-19, such as an allergy, persistent cough etc. the advice is you must take your child to see a GP, get COVID tested and return your child to school with a doctor's certificate and negative test result,
- If you are asked to self-isolate, please advise the Office and do not come on site.

A LETTER TO PARENT / CARERS FROM ADJ CLIN PROF BRETT SUTTON, VIC CHIEF HEALTH OFFICER

I would like to take this opportunity to thank students, staff, teachers, parents, and carers for ensuring a safe and successful start to the 2021 school year and to thank you for your cooperation during the short period of remote learning in February during the circuit breaker restrictions. As Term 2 commences, schools continue to be able to operate with a largely normal program of activity, enabling important on site activities to return, such as school open days and working bees, with appropriate health and safety measures in place. Throughout the pandemic, Victorian schools have rapidly and successfully adapted to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission, embedding COVIDSafe principles by reinforcing good behaviours, creating safe spaces, adapting activities, and responding quickly to COVID-19 risk. While we have seen outbreaks emerge in Victoria, we have also witnessed our capacity to respond quickly to limit the impact of these outbreaks.

Given the current very low risk of COVID-19 transmission in the community, continued high rates of testing and wastewater monitoring, and continued observance of health and safety measures in schools; those with medical vulnerabilities or their carers can feel reassured to continue to safely work and learn on school sites, and enjoy the benefits of doing so.

It is crucial, however, for everyone to remain vigilant by staying home when unwell, performing regular hand hygiene, wearing a mask when required, and maintaining physical distancing from others when practical. Should cases of COVID-19 increase again in the community, I am confident that with COVIDSafe plans in place, alongside our ability to quickly identify and respond to cases, schools remain safe places for all staff and students. I also continue to be reassured by evidence that children are less impacted by the virus and are less likely to develop severe illness.

The school community continues to have an important role to promote COVID-19 testing when a student or staff member has any symptoms, no matter how mild, and ensuring they remain home until they are well. Getting tested and staying home until results are known is critical to limiting community transmission.

YEAR 3/4 CAMP TO BILLABONG RANCH, ECHUCA

By the time you read this, the Year 3/4's will be enjoying their camp at Billabong Ranch, just outside Echuca. Today's schedule involved leaving the school by bus, arriving at camp, participating in a raft of camp-based activities (ropes course, paddle boats etc) and setting up sleeping quarters. Tomorrow we will all be off to Echuca to enjoy some of the exciting tourist attractions on offer. Just a reminder that the bus returns at approximately 3:30pm and you would be best to pick your child up, rather than rely on trying to connect with the Ravenswood or Kangaroo Flat buses.

P&F MOTHERS DAY STALL

Next week will see our P&F working hard to prepare, set-up and run a MOTHERS DAY stall for all of our students to attend... and buy a gift (or two) should they wish. Families can then opt to purchase the following day (or after school Thursday) should they wish. No pressure. A big thank you to our P&F for doing such a great job returning some of our cherished events to the school calendar.

CAMPS - COST... repeat from last week's newsletter

School camps are expensive – the cost of a camp includes bus travel, food, accommodation and activities / tourist attractions etc. Sometimes, if you have more than one attending, this can be just too overwhelming. Can I remind families to apply for Camps Sports Excursions Funding (CSEF) if eligible – it's not too late to apply. This gives each eligible child \$125 of credit to use towards activities like camp. If you are unsure of your entitlement, please contact the Office. In addition to this, we offer part payment options – enabling families to pay off a camp over a long period of time. Our Year 5/6 Camp is in Term 4... so why not start now? As always, if financial difficulty is an issue for a family, I'd prefer you speak to me to see what I can do to help you RATHER than a child miss out. Ultimately, it's your choice of course, but our camping program is designed to foster independence away from home, develop friendships, expose children to new situations, opportunities and much more. If you want your child to attend, but they aren't going due to finance – please speak to me. Your personal situation is always discreetly discussed with school staff or myself. We're here to help – so drop in for a chat if you need.

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES FROM SCHOOL, ABSENCES ETC... repeat from last week's newsletter

It's concerning to sometimes see children dropped off at school way too early. By law, your child should not be on site until 8:45am or after. If you need your child to be at school before this time, please enrol your child at our BEFORE school care service by calling the Office. At the end of the day, children need to be promptly collected at 3:15pm, with collection no later than 3:30pm. If you cannot collect your child until after 3:30pm, please enrol your child in our AFTER school care service by calling the Office. When arriving late to school, please sign your child in at the Office. When collecting children early, ensure they are also signed out. Finally, on days where your child is away, either ring the school and talk to us / leave a message OR text 0438 738 788 to advise that your child is away and the reason why – eg: illness, family holiday, appointment etc. Due to Department of Education and Training regulations, we have to code absences, thus the reason why we need to know why they are away. Thanks for your cooperation.

<u>NAPLAN - NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM LITERACY AND NUMERACY... repeat from last week's newsletter</u>

We have the resumption of NAPLAN testing in Week 4 of this term for all Year 3 and 5 students. Last year NAPLAN did not go ahead due to COVID-19 and restrictions / lockdown. Thankfully this year, it resumes for children in Years 3 and 5. Testing dates this year are Tuesday, 11th, Wednesday, 12th and Thursday, 13th of May. Tests occur in the morning blocks and assess READING, WRITING, LANGUAGE CONVENTIONS (spelling, grammar etc) and MATHEMATICS. If you are concerned about your child and NAPLAN testing, please speak to me. Children can be EXEMPT from NAPLAN testing due to a disability or English Language Proficiency issue. They can also be WITHDRAWN by parents if a parent is concerned that the testing may not be in the best interests of the child. Both exemption and withdrawal are a formal process, so contact with myself is required to ensure this occurs.

Next balancing deadline 30 June

We are reminding families about the next deadline for balancing Child Care Subsidy (CCS).

There are two important deadlines that fall on **30 June 2021**:

- the second deadline for confirming 2018–19 income, and
- the first deadline for confirming 2019–20 income.

Confirming 2018-19 income

Most families confirmed their 2018–19 income before the first deadline on 31 March 2021. Any families who still haven't confirmed their 2018–19 income must do so by the second deadline on 30 June 2021. If they don't, they may need to pay back all the CCS they got in 2018–19.

Confirming 2019-20 income


Many families have confirmed their 2019–20 income already. If they haven't, they must do so by the first deadline on 30 June 2021. If they don't, their CCS will stop and they'll need to pay full fees for child care.

How do families confirm their income?

You confirm your income by:

- lodging your tax return, or
- telling Services Australia you don't need to lodge a tax return. Families can complete an <u>Advise</u> <u>non-lodgement of tax return</u> using their <u>Centrelink</u> <u>online account</u> through <u>myGov</u> or through the <u>Express Plus Centrelink mobile app</u>. You'll need to do this even if you've already told the Australian Taxation Office they don't need to lodge.

If a parent separates from their partner/s, Services Australia will also need their ex-partner's income. If a parent is concerned that their ex-partner/s won't lodge their tax return by the deadline they should call 136150.
