School Organisation

Dear Parent/s, Guardian/s and Carer/s,
 Welcome to Week 1 of Term 4... our final and longest term, covering 11 weeks in the lead up to the Summer break. We have returned in the same setting as we left at the end of Term 3, which isn't ideal, but what we have to do to try and keep our children and community safe. I'll endeavour to put as much information in this newsletter to keep you informed of what is going on etc, as we move forward.

STAGED RETURN TO FULL TIME SCHOOLING

This week we have had our Prep & Year 1/2 students on site every day. This will continue into the coming weeks. Our Year 3 – 6 students have worked remote this week, however, we have also provided on site supervision for VULNERABLE and the children of ESSENTIAL WORKERS each day. In essence, the school is running in three modes, which has been tricky... but is working well. To help parents / carers better understand how we will work in Week 2, 3 and 4, the following information was posted on our Facebook Page, uploaded to our website, emailed and sent out via our Flexischools app:

The Victorian Government has announced the Roadmap to Deliver the National Plan. The Roadmap, which is based on advice from the Victorian Chief Health Officer, sets out the staged return to on site learning in Term 4, with the plan being that all students return on site by **Tuesday, 26th October**. For schools in regional Victoria LGA's that are not on restricted settings, this is as follows:

Where schools in a local government area (LGA) are scheduled to or have commenced a return to on site learning, and that LGA is then placed on restricted settings, then those schools will return to the settings in place at that time for [metropolitan Melbourne](#). This currently includes schools in the LGAs of Mitchell Shire, City of Latrobe and City of Greater Shepparton. For our school, this means that the following arrangements will be in place:

Remote and flexible learning will be delivered to students on the days they are not on site. Vulnerable children and children of parents or guardians who were on the authorised provider and authorised worker list can continue attending on site, but must be booked in the week before via a signed booking form. Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) programs will be open for all students during Term 4 in line with their return to on site attendance at school.

So taking it one week at a time, NEXT WEEK (Week 2), we will have our Prep & Year 1/2's attending every day. Our MIDDLE UNIT (children in Wendy, Dean and Renae/Leisha's room) will return for full days of school on TUESDAY and WEDNESDAY only (please note Wendy's Year 2's continue to attend full time). Our SENIOR UNIT (Ainsley, Lauren/Roberta, Brett and Kate's classes) will return for full days of school on THURSDAY and FRIDAY only (please note that all of Brett's class will attend on the Thursday and Friday including the Year 4's). Week 3 will be exactly the same. In Week 4, it will be our Prep & Year 1/2's face-to-face on Monday, then we will welcome back our entire school on Tuesday, 26th October.

Please return children to full schooling days with all the learning materials that were sent home. Advise your child to pack up what they need when returning home for remote after their two days also.

REMOTE LEARNING

For the majority of our Year 3-6's remote learning continues. Teachers of these classes remain remote and are working with children through different platforms. Our Middle Unit is using Dojo, Email, Webex and various support websites / applications. Our Senior Unit is using Showbie, Email and Essential Assessment. Please do not think your child can wind down – keep motivating them to do the work. It's been a long haul, but what is important is your child's academic progress and their wellbeing... so with no more than 2.5 – 3 hours of work set a day, adequate time can be spent supporting your child's wellbeing. It's important to do that. When you have an issue, please don't hesitate to reach out to our staff – I've seen them go to great lengths to engage children and help them... even setting up 1:1 meetings to support.

ON SITE SUPERVISION FOR MIDDLE AND SENIOR STUDENTS

Next week on site supervision for the children of ESSENTIAL WORKERS and VULNERABLE is available for MIDDLE UNIT on Monday, Thursday and Friday and SENIOR UNIT on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. By the time this newsletter is published, bookings for next week will have closed to enable the school time to employ additional staff and organise learning areas in preparation. If you have missed booking in for Week 2, please remember that you automatically have the MIDDLE UNIT on site for normal classes on Tuesday and Wednesday and the SENIOR UNIT on site for normal classes on Thursday and Friday. This will hopefully help those deemed vulnerable to have some time at school and break the monotony.

YEAR 5/6 CAMP TO ANGLESEA

It was with great sadness that we had to cancel our Year 5/6 camp for 2021. Unfortunately, with the current outbreak of COVID-19 DELTA, we are not able to safely take the children and staff away. There is also no option to reschedule due to the uncertainty and limited time. Kerry is busy organising refunds of monies paid.

COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS – WHAT IT MEANS FOR OUR STUDENTS ON SITE

To make it clearer for our families, I've broken down below some of the major changes in place at school to keep children safe.

Currently:

- Children are encouraged to wear a mask indoors. Masks are provided, however, children are able to bring one from home that might fit them better. They don't have to wear masks outdoors,
- Children are encouraged to wash hands / use hand sanitiser regularly throughout the day and at key times. We have been changing some of our bubbler taps back to washing stations,
- Drink bottles are encouraged for the remainder of the year. Please ensure children come to school with one. We do have some bubblers left for those that forget – eg: at the front of the multipurpose room,
- There is no cross Unit mixing of children indoors. This means that First Steps children can mix inside, however, we can't do things with the First Steps and Junior Unit together inside. This will be the same when the Middle and Senior Units are on site,
- Hands off play is encourage in the yard,
- Regular additional cleaning of touch points occurs every day for all indoor areas,
- No assemblies or mass gatherings of students occur currently, unless via remote methods,
- Incursions and excursions are unable to proceed at this time,
- Children who have flu-like symptoms must not come to school. If a child becomes unwell while at school, they will be sent home. Recurring illnesses must be explained by a negative COVID-19 test result and letter from a Doctor advising of a safe return to school,
- Children who have been to an exposure site need to isolate immediately and get tested – returning to school under the advice of DHHS.

COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS –

WHAT IT MEANS FOR PARENTS, CARERS AND ADULT VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

As I have done above, restrictions have changed for adults in our community too.

Currently:

- Adults are unable to enter any indoor space / classroom other than the Office,
- Adult visitors must check in using the QR code whenever they come into the Office,
- Meetings with teachers or staff need to be done via telephone, email or Webex,
- Adults on site must wear a mask at all times and social distance,
- When coming into our Office, please follow the density limits, use the hand sanitiser available and maintain safe distance,
- Stay off site if you are unwell or have any symptoms,
- If you have been to a Tier 1 or 2 exposure site, please ensure you follow the directions of DHHS and not attend the school,
- Adults cannot attend any school events on site during this time.

FEELING SICK? FLU-LIKE SYMPTOMS?

If your child reports to you that they have any flu-like symptoms, sore throat, runny nose, loss of smell or taste, cough, sneezing etc, then please leave them at home. By law, your child must not come to school if they are feeling unwell in any of the ways outlined. It can be a burden having to stay home with unwell children, but in current times, you will need to. For adults visiting the school for pick up etc, please ensure you stay off site if feeling unwell. This is so important currently, with children being the majority of infected each day in Victoria. As children are unvaccinated, they are susceptible to picking up the illness as they mingle and mix together... and many won't wear masks. This is why, if your child is booked in for on site supervision but has ANY SYMPTOM, they must stay home. Please think of others and comply if you have a sick child during on site supervision days.

SUNSMART – HATS ON IN TERM 4 😊

This week we have been flexible with the wearing of hats, however, next week if a child is at school without a hat, they have to play undercover. This is what we call NO HAT NO PLAY. As we are a Sunsmart school, in line with our policy, children must wear a hat when outdoors in Term 1 and 4. In addition to this, we encourage children to come to school with sunscreen on and also reapply with their own throughout the day. As an extra layer of precaution, we also monitor the UV ratings each day and when we have times where the UV rating is above 8, children have an indoor play instead. Hats are always available from the Office to purchase for \$10. Children can be sent to school with money to purchase one and we will put your child's name on it. Alternatively, you can purchase one via our Qkr app, and we will put your child's name on it.

CLASS PLACEMENTS FOR 2022 – YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO PROVIDE INFORMATION

Starting today, parents / carers are able to provide information to the Principal to consider when making class placements for 2022. Attached to this newsletter is our Policy relating to this. Please read the document and ensure any correspondence sent to me complies with the policy. Each year we give parents a window to email or put in writing their considerations for 2022 placement of children. Whilst it is unknown what the class structure will be, you could assume it will be similar to 2021 (P/Yr 1, Yr 1/2, Yr 3/4 and Yr 5/6). It is possible that we could have a Yr 2/3 or a Yr 4/5 also. Staffing allocation has not been done yet and teachers are not necessarily always going to teach the same area... however, you can kindly make suggestions / requests within the policy guidelines. Please note, previous requests no longer stand. If there is something you want taken into account, please put it in writing. Only requests put in writing to the Principal will be considered... talking to a staff member does not suffice. Class placement requests will close on Friday, 22nd October. No late requests will be accepted sorry. Written requests can be dropped at the Office or emailed to Matthew.Pearce@education.vic.gov.au.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

Usually the *Department of Education and Training (DET)* requires us to have 8 School Council meetings a year. As was the case last year, the requirement was dropped from 8 to 6 due to the impact of COVID-19 this week. I propose to School Councillors that since we met so late in Term 3 and were scheduled to meet early Term 4 that we remove our October meeting and wait until the November date instead. Please remove the October School Council date from your calendars.

NAPLAN

Individual student reports have arrived and will be sent home with Year 3 students next Tuesday / Wednesday and Year 5 students next Thursday / Friday when they are on site. Please remember that the test is a snapshot of your child on a particular day. We have some reports that are over-inflated and others that undersell the skill-sets of your child. The best indication of your child's progress is the teacher's judgement as reported in the most recently Semester 1 reports. Unlike NAPLAN, Teacher Judgement is based on multiple sets of data to verify accuracy, whereas NAPLAN is a snapshot. Should you wish to discuss the NAPLAN report further, this would best be done with your child's teacher via email, phone or Webex.

KINDER – PREP ENROLMENT

If you have not enrolled your child for Prep, 2022... please contact the Office / Janet Dean as soon as possible. In addition to this, if you have family or friends you know want to come to the school, please encourage them to make contact ASAP to avoid disappointment. For parents wanting to organise a tour, we are unable to provide school tours currently due to COVID-19 restrictions. When a time arrives when this can be done safely, we will advise on our website.

MOVING ON NEXT YEAR?

If a change calls and you are leaving the area, moving to the other side of Bendigo etc, please advise us as early as possible. We are collating numbers of students to begin organising class structures for 2022, so knowing if a child is leaving is really helpful. Please don't feel embarrassed to ring the Office and advise.

CHILDREN AGED 12 AND OVER ARE ELIGIBLE NOW TO BE VACCINATED

As part of the COVID-19 vaccination roll-out, from Monday, 13th September, all Victorians aged 12 and older are [eligible to book and receive a COVID-19 vaccine](#) at a state vaccination centre, a Commonwealth vaccination centre, or through a GP clinic, pharmacy or community health service. Vaccination bookings for students should be made by following the instructions under the heading 'How to book an appointment' below (underlined text is a hyperlink in our online newsletter). Vaccination is not mandatory but is strongly encouraged. Getting vaccinated is the best way to protect our school community from further outbreaks and the spread of COVID-19. The Victorian Government's aim is to provide an opportunity for all children aged 12 years and older to receive at least one vaccine dose by the end of the school year. In the case of our 12+ year old students, the health professional administering the vaccine will seek consent from the student's parent/carer. Parents/carers can complete a [consent form for COVID-19 vaccination](#) for their child to bring to their appointment, or parents/carers can attend with their child to provide consent in person. *How to book an appointment:* Bookings for a Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine can be made for children aged 12 years and older via state vaccination centres, Commonwealth vaccination centres, GP clinics, pharmacies and community health services. Find a participating Commonwealth vaccination centre, GP, pharmacy or community health service through the [Australian Government Eligibility Checker](#). You can book your appointment online or by calling the vaccine provider nearest to you. Students (and families) can book or change a vaccination appointment at a state vaccination centre through the [Victorian Government's COVID-19 vaccine online booking system](#). FUTURE EVENTS?

So many of our scheduled events in Term 4 are up in the air. Our LIFE SKILLS PROGRAM (Years 3-6) may be moved to Term 1, Interschool Sports can't currently occur, scheduled excursions are not permitted at the moment, swimming can only occur when a pool has exclusive use by one setting, our Melbourne Cup Family Fun day is looking unlikely so to not allowing cross-unit mixing and running our two concerts also looks problematic. Where possible we will run what we can for the benefit of the children. It's not looking likely that we will be able to involve our community on site, but will look into ways to stream or video such events. I've advised staff that the events with the best chance of occurring are those in the second half of the term. For now, we will just have to take things week by week.

FAMILY ACCOUNTS

Kerry is working on processing credit notes for the Year 5/6 Camp and the First Steps & Junior Unit Gym program. These credits will sit on your family account and can be used for future excursions such as swimming etc. If you would like a refund for the Year 5/6 Camp, please email your bank details – account name/number and BSB to Kerry at kerry.prentice@education.vic.gov.au ASAP. 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CLASS PLACEMENT POLICY

Purpose

To create the best possible learning environment, which is equitable, to all students and their families.

Guidelines

1. *That the underlying principles are educational and in the best interests of all children,*
2. *That involvement in the process is within the framework of specified criteria,*
3. *That the final responsibility for class placement and/or pupil movement remains primarily with the Principal / delegate.*

Implementation

1. The specified criteria for movement of a child from one class to another are as follows:
 - Special needs of children (ie: emotional, psychological, behavioural, disabilities),
 - Equitable distribution of children (ie: learning, gender, behaviour considerations),
 - Within unit requests (ie: for children to be placed or not placed within a class for family groupings),
 - Flexibility in grouping will be encouraged in movement between Units or Year levels,
 - Children should have at least one friend accompany him or her to the next class,
 - Parents of a pre-school child are provided with the opportunity to indicate a friend with whom they would like their child placed as part of the enrolment process.
2. People who may be involved in the class selection process are as follows:
 - The child's class teacher,
 - The school's transition teachers,
 - Parent(s) of a special needs child,
 - Parent(s) who have views regarding family grouping,
 - Other staff involved in the child's education, such as specialists who have specific special needs information,
 - Pre-school staff,
 - First Steps, Junior Unit, Middle Unit and Senior Unit staff,
 - The Principal.
3. Parents are to write to the Principal stating any educational considerations by **Friday, 22nd October**.
 - Records of decisions which have been made regarding placement of children for various reasons, especially behaviour, will be kept,
 - The Principal / delegate will be responsible for keeping this information,
 - All requests will receive either a verbal or written reply so parents understand staff reasons for student placement.
4. If there has been an ongoing concern during the year and there has been contact between the parent, teacher and Principal, a child could be moved to another class in the following year. This action should take place only after discussions with the Principal / delegate and the involved parties.
5. In the event of new students altering the class structure or dynamics, some children may need to be moved to another class early in the school year.

Student enrolment numbers will be a major factor in determining class structures.
