GISBORNE PRIMARY SCHOOL VISIT

On Monday our Unit / Professional Learning Communities (PLC) Leaders, our Learning Specialist and myself visited Gisborne Primary School, which is a link school for the PLC approach. Gisborne is set up and funded to model and share the best ways of working to improve student outcomes through PLC's. The visit was amazing and we got some great ideas about tweaking how we work for greater benefit. The upcoming Curriculum Day in June is focused on our PLC work and will again involve support from Gisborne and our Regional PLC Leader. Ainsley, our Learning Specialist, is working hard with our SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT TEAM (SIT) members to make sure we get a lot out of our Curriculum Day together.

KINDER - FOUNDATION / PREP TRANSITION

This week we have been busy opening the school to interested families wanting to explore enrolment of their Kinder child at Big Hill PS in 2024. On Tuesday I had a well-attended tour, where families were shown around the school, were given enrolment information and provided the opportunity to ask lots of questions. This opportunity is again extended to interested families of Kinder children tomorrow at 10:00am. On Tuesday night we also held our KINDER – FOUNDATION INFORMATION SESSION, with several families coming along to listen to a presentation from Nicole, Jayden, Sharyn and myself. This provided interested families with information about the school and our programs... as well as a close look at a PREP / FOUNDATION classroom. A big thank you to those involved in preparing and organising such an informative session for our interested families. OSHC NEWS

Families can now use the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) Calculator at StartingBlocks.gov.au to see what their subsidy rates may be from 10 July.

Most families will get more subsidy. Some families previously not eligible will be able to get it.

CCS: balancing deadlines approaching

Families must confirm what they earned in 2021-22 and 2020-21 by 30 June to avoid losing CCS or incurring a debt.

At the end of each financial year, Services Australia compares a family's income estimate with their actual income to check they got the right amount of CCS. This process is called balancing.

Families need to confirm their income for balancing to occur. There are deadlines for families to do this.

Next deadlines


The end of financial year marks two important deadlines for families:

- first deadline for confirming 2021-22 income
- second deadline for confirming 2020-21 income.

If a family misses the first deadline, their CCS will stop. If a family misses the second deadline, they will lose their CCS eligibility and may have to repay any CCS they got for that financial year.
