With the end of Week 9 fast approaching, it's hard to believe that we have a week of school left before the term break. Next week is very busy, so it's worth noting all that is going on at Big Hill PS.

PLANNING WEEK

Next week will see our teachers working together in their teams to plan for Term 4. This planning time ensures that teachers match their lessons to the expected Victorian Curriculum Outcomes, ensuring that your child is taught all that is mandated in our Curriculum. First Steps will plan Monday, Middle Unit on Tuesday, Junior Unit on Wednesday and finally, Senior Unit on Thursday. Specialist programs will be affected due to the rearrangement of programs to release teachers for planning. Please, if your child likes routine and is disturbed by change, talk to them about what day they will have a different teacher due to planning and prepare for a specialist teacher or Casual Relief Teacher to be working in the room on that day.

STUDENT AWARDS CEREMONY

Next week, on the final day - Friday, 15th September, we will host our STUDENT AWARDS ASSEMBLY at 9:00am. This will be outdoors, weather permitting. CLASS PLACEMENT POLICY

Each year families have the chance to indicate where they think their child might be best suited class-wise in 2024. It is not to pick the teacher, rather, a chance to advise us of special friendships or relationships that don't work. Sometimes a parent might signal the child has enjoyed a teacher and would love to have them again OR would love a female teacher after a few years with a male. Overall, we make the best choice for your child however, if you wish to put in a request, I encourage you to stick within the policy (attached) to ensure your requests are correctly worded and respectful of others. Class placement requests are due by the first Friday of Term 4, Friday, 6th October. Next year we anticipate a FIRST STEPS UNIT (Foundation, possibly Foundation / Year 1), JUNIOR UNIT (Year 1/2), MIDDLE UNIT (Year 3/4, possibly a Year 2/3) and SENIOR UNIT (Year 5/6). We don't know whom is teaching at what level as yet, however, hope that there isn't too much change to this year.




BHPS 2023 School Productions



Junior Production – Thursday 14th September Senior Production – Thursday 2nd November

Dear Parents.



There will be two productions, one for First Steps & Junior Unit and one for Middle Unit & Senior Unit. The Junior Production is called 'Rock Pool' and is a musical based on sea creatures and rock and roll music. The Senior production is called 'Mission Implausible' and is a secret agent/spy-parody musical taking influence from Mission Impossible and the James Bond films.



Venue Location

The Bendigo Baptist Church, 757 McIvor Hwy, Junortoun

Dates / Times

Junior Production:

Thursday, 14th September 1:00pm Matinee 6:00pm Evening

Senior Production:

Thursday, 2nd November 1:00pm Matinee 6:00pm Evening

Each production is expected to run between 40 to 60 minutes.

Buses / Transport

Matinee: All students will travel by bus to and from the Baptist Church on the day of their respective Production to perform the Matinee. They will require lunch, snacks, a water bottle, any required medication, and costumes/props to be brought with them.

Evening Production: Families are required to transport their students to the venue, as well as bring any costumes and props required. Students can wear their costumes to the venue or get changed after they arrive, although please ensure enough time is allowed prior to the performance for preparation of props and costumes. There will be plenty of parking at the front and the back of the venue for parents and guests. Entry into the venue is via the front main entrance. On arrival to the production, it is asked that students performing are dropped off into the function room (immediately to the right after walking in the main entrance). This is where the student performers will wait with a teacher and get organised in their groups until they are ready to walk backstage, ready for their performance.

Tickets

Tickets will be on sale in the coming weeks at the Office.

There will only be a limited number of cash only tickets available at the door for each performance.

Auditions

Auditions will take place during school time in the next few weeks. It is important that students have in mind what their highest priority role / character is, as well as at least 1 or 2 other roles that they would be happy to do. It is not guaranteed that they will get their first pick. The character list is on display in the music room and will be discussed during school hours this term.

Roles

Each student will be taking on one or two roles for the production. Some of the roles require a large amount of practise and hard work in order to memorise the lines and play the role convincingly. Some students will require less rehearsal time, but will still require time to memorise certain song lyrics and choreography. If your child has a special exemption from performing, or will be absent on the day, please let me or their classroom teacher know as soon as possible. All students are expected to participate, as involvement is part of the Assessment for Semester 2 in Music. There will be plenty of variety in roles to suit the needs of all students, including many non-speaking parts for extras, as well as ensemble members who will primarily be involved in the song performances.

Costumes / Props

Many of the props and finer details of the costumes will be supplied by our Art teacher Alice, as well as our classroom teachers, however some clothing basics will be required of families to provide.

Please speak to your child to confirm their role in the performance. This will be finalised by Week 5 of Term 3 for the Junior Production and Week 7 of Term 3 for the Senior Production.

If families have any suitable costumes or props that they could help us out with, please email me at nickolas.reid@education.vic.gov.au. Any support we can get from the school community with costumes and props will be greatly appreciated.


Scripts and Rehearsing

Students will be able to do most of their practise during school hours in their music lessons, as well as in some class time with classroom teachers. Students are welcome to practice their singing, dancing, or instrumental roles at home as well. I will have a small amount of planning time available each week in which he can take certain groups of students for additional preparation for the Production where required.

CLASS PLACEMENT POLICY

Purpose

To create the best possible learning environment, which is equitable, to all students and their families.

Guidelines

- 1. That the underlying principles are educational and in the best interests of all children,
- 2. That involvement in the process is within the framework of specified criteria,
- 3. That the final responsibility for class placement and / or pupil movement remains primarily with the Principal / delegate.

Implementation

- 1. The specified criteria for movement of a child from one class to another are as follows:
 - Special needs of children (ie: emotional, psychological, behavioural, disabilities),
 - Equitable distribution of children (ie: learning, gender, behaviour considerations),
 - Within Unit requests (ie: for children to be placed or not placed within a class for family groupings),
 - Flexibility in grouping will be encouraged in movement between Units or Year levels,
 - Children should have at least one friend accompany him or her to the next class,
 - Parents of a Preschool child are provided with the opportunity to indicate a friend with whom they would like their child placed as part of the enrolment process.
- 2. People who may be involved in the class selection process are as follows:
 - The child's class teacher,
 - The school's transition teachers,
 - Parent(s) of a special needs child,
 - Parent(s) who have views regarding family grouping,
 - Other staff involved in the child's education, such as specialists who have specific special needs information,
 - Preschool staff.
 - First Steps, Junior Unit, Middle Unit and Senior Unit staff,
 - The Principal.
- 3. Parents are to write to the Principal stating any educational considerations by **Friday**, **6**th **October**.
 - Records of decisions which have been made regarding placement of children for various reasons, especially behaviour, will be kept,
 - The Principal / delegate will be responsible for keeping this information,
 - All requests will receive either a verbal or written reply so parents understand staff reasons for student placement.
- 4. If there has been an ongoing concern during the year and there has been contact between the parent, teacher and Principal, a child could be moved to another class in the following year. This action should take place only after discussions with the Principal / delegate and the involved parties.
- 5. In the event of new students altering the class structure or dynamics, some children may need to be moved to another class early in the school year.

Student enrolment numbers will be a major factor in determining class structures.

The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.
