DAY FOR DANIEL - TOMORROW! WEAR RED AND ACTIVE TRAVEL TO SCHOOL

Tomorrow, Friday 27th October, is DAY FOR DANIEL. Children are hopefully making the most of fundraising opportunities and will hopefully wear red (red t-shirt, jumper, cap, ribbon in hair etc) in support of the day. We will have an active travel morning with children able to meet a staff member at Phillis Street at 8:30am and walk/scoot to school. We currently have great opportunities for suitable applicants to join our team as part time and casual School Crossing Supervisors in the Greater Bendigo region.


School Crossing Supervisors are responsible for ensuring the safe and orderly use of the school crossings used by children and other customers at schools across the City of Greater Bendigo.

Each shift is up to 60 minutes in duration, but normally 45 minutes between the hours of 8am – 9am and 3pm – 4pm. Each 45 minute shift is paid minimum approx. \$27 (plus superannuation).

We try and allocate a school crossing close to your home. Small daily travel allowance is paid.
