Choose Junior or Senior Concert tickets, add the item to cart, proceed to review order, customise and then you can add the free Primary Aged & under tickets.

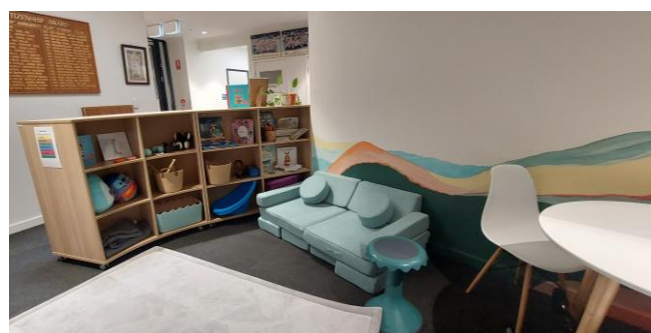
These will then be sent home with the eldest child in the family within 48 hours of purchase.

Navigating the Digital World: Your GPS for the Online Adventure

Pop-ups and Malware: More Than Just an Annoying Nuisance

Back in my day, the closest thing we had to a “pop-up” was Mum yelling from the kitchen that dinner was ready. Then came the trusty old dial up modem, screeching away as it connected us to the “World Wide Web”. Fast forward a few years, and suddenly our computer screens were being hijacked by flashing boxes telling us we’d won a holiday to the Gold Coast. All we had to do was “click here!” Sadly, some of us did. And just like the days when companies like Reef told us that baking in the sun was good for us (a myth many of us are paying for now), we’ve since learned the hard way that pop-ups are rarely good news.

The Pop-Up Problem

For many adults, pop-ups are just irritating, an extra click of the mouse to close the box. But for kids and teens, they can be a gateway to something more sinister. Behind the bright colours and “limited time offers” are often scams, viruses, or malware that can do serious damage.

Pop-ups can:

- Trick kids into downloading harmful software,
- Lead to dodgy websites spreading misinformation or scams,
- Collect personal information without consent,
- Open the door to more persistent online threats.

Malware: The Invisible Hitchhiker

If pop-ups are the lure, malware is the hook. Malware can sneak onto a device and sit quietly in the background, tracking passwords, reading messages, or even locking up a computer until a ransom is paid. Sounds like a crime thriller, but it’s happening every day in Aussie households. And once it’s in, it’s not as easy as chucking the cricket ball back over the fence, sometimes the damage is long lasting.

Teaching Kids to Be Critical

At school, we’re working hard to teach kids how to think critically online, just like we teach them to question whether a headline on social media is fact or fiction. A flashing pop-up promising a free iPhone is just another version of the old “stranger offering lollies” scenario, too good to be true, and likely dangerous.

But this job can’t be left to schools alone. Home and school need to work hand in hand. Parents can talk openly with their kids about what to do if a pop-up appears, set up adblockers, and remind them never to click on anything suspicious without checking first. It’s the modern version of teaching kids to look both ways before crossing the road.

Final Thoughts

Pop-ups and malware might feel like just another tech headache, but they’re also an important teaching moment. We don’t want kids growing up scared of technology, but we do want them to grow up smart with it. Just like we finally realised that frying ourselves in the sun wasn’t such a bright idea, we need to make sure the next generation knows that clicking random pop-ups can land them in just as much strife. With a bit of teamwork between home and school, we can give our kids the tools to navigate the online world safely, and maybe even save a few computers along the way.

Safe travels on the internet highway, where your data’s the passenger, and you’re the navigator!

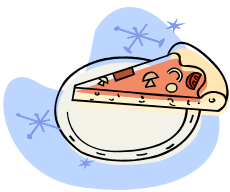
