ISSUES ON THE FOOTPATH TO SCHOOL

When facing issues with the public on the way to and from school, please report this immediately and directly to Police by calling 000. Whilst in this instance it might feel like I'm focusing on an individual, I'm actually reminding all in the community what to do with any unknown or unpredictable pedestrian on our paths... so... if a person, any person, is being unsafe or creates a danger for our students when travelling to or from school, then it is reportable. We appreciate you advising us... and like many of you... we are also reporting when situations arise where there could be a safety concern for our students. What is in your control is keeping an eye on the paths and making decisions about the right time to walk or ride to school, reminding your child not to engage with members of the public in any discourse and to avoid walking onto the road / highway to avoid danger... as the highway is an even bigger risk. Collectively we can work with our students around safe ways to travel to and from school whilst also reporting to those who can manage the situation, ie: the Police, in the hope that there can be a good outcome for all involved.

Past requests are null and void, so if there is a historical reason we need to consider, please email me. If you have spoken to a teacher about your request, still email me. If it's not in writing to me, it won't be considered - so please email Matthew.Pearce@education.vic.gov.au before the closing date to be considered.

All class placement requests need to be received by the first Friday of Term 4 – Friday, 10th of October.

SOCIAL MEDIA & CYBER SAFETY

Navigating the Digital World: Your GPS for the Online Adventure What's New and Coming Soon:

No Helmet, No Ride, and Now, No Click Without an Age Check

The old saying goes, "On the internet, nobody knows you're a dog." But here in Australia, that might soon change. From search engines and social media sites to app stores and AI chatbots, companies will be required to know the ages of their users, and not just with a simple tick-box pop-up asking if someone is over 18. That kind of system no longer cuts it!

The push is all about keeping kids safe from harmful material online, recognising that a quick "yes, I'm 18" click doesn't protect anyone. The eSafety Commissioner is stepping in as the watchdog, making sure the big tech players lift their game and put real safeguards in place. It's about moving beyond lip service and ensuring genuine responsibility when it comes to protecting our youngest Aussies online.

Sadly, many of us grew up in an era where kids once rode bikes without helmets, but now it's unthinkable. The online world is no different. For years, we've been told that pop-ups, disclaimers, and a simple "click yes if you're over 18" button were enough to keep kids safe online. But, just like those old sunscreen ads, we know better now.

From 27 December 2025, tech giants like Google and Microsoft will be required to verify the ages of logged-in users, or face fines of almost \$50 million per breach. This follows Australia's quiet introduction of new rules back in June, designed to reduce children's exposure to harmful online material. But rules alone won't solve everything!

Parents know the reality: kids are quick learners, and many find ways around barriers. Age-assurance technology is an improvement, but it isn't foolproof. Just as we've taught kids about stranger danger, road safety, and sun safety, online safety is another area where families and schools must work hand-in-hand.

The government and the eSafety Commissioner are set to release further details for social media platforms in the coming weeks, ahead of the ban's commencement. But even then, challenges remain. Can age-assurance technology really be accurate? Will there ever be a one-size-fits-all solution? Or is this just the start of a longer journey?

And let's not forget, harmful material online doesn't only come from obvious sites. Pop-ups can carry malware, games often include chat features that aren't well-policed, and even mainstream search engines can lead kids somewhere they're not ready for. This is why the upcoming code for search engines is such an important step.

Final Thoughts

New rules are a step in the right direction, but they don't replace the role of parents, carers, and teachers. Just as we learned to slip, slop, slap, we now need to model and teach good digital habits. That means open conversations at home, building critical thinking skills, and encouraging kids to pause before they click.

Technology may provide the guardrails, but it's our guidance, at school and at home, that truly keeps our kids safe.

Safe travels on the internet highway, where your data's the passenger, and you're the navigator!

CLASS PLACEMENT POLICY 2025

Purpose

To create the best possible learning environment, which is equitable, to all students and their families.

Guidelines

- 1. That the underlying principles are educational and in the best interests of all children,
- 2. That involvement in the process is within the framework of specified criteria,
- 3. That the final responsibility for class placement and / or pupil movement remains primarily with the Principal / delegate.

Implementation

- 1. The specified criteria for movement of a child from one class to another are as follows:
 - Special needs of children (ie: emotional, psychological, behavioural, disabilities),
 - Equitable distribution of children (ie: learning, gender, behaviour considerations),
 - Within Unit requests (ie: for children to be placed or not placed within a class for family groupings),
 - Flexibility in grouping will be encouraged in movement between Units or Year levels,
 - Children should have at least one friend accompany him or her to the next class,
 - Parents of a Preschool child are provided with the opportunity to indicate a friend with whom they would like their child placed as part of the enrolment process.
- 2. People who may be involved in the class selection process are as follows:
 - The child's class teacher,
 - The school's transition teachers,
 - Parent(s) of a special needs child,
 - Parent(s) who have views regarding family grouping,
 - Other staff involved in the child's education, such as specialists who have specific special needs information,
 - Preschool staff,
 - First Steps, Junior Unit, Middle Unit and Senior Unit staff,
 - The Principal.
- 3. Parents are to write to the Principal stating any educational considerations by Friday, 10th October.
 - Records of decisions which have been made regarding placement of children for various reasons, especially behaviour, will be kept,
 - The Principal / delegate will be responsible for keeping this information,
 - All requests will receive either a verbal or written reply so parents understand staff reasons for student placement.
- 4. If there has been an ongoing concern during the year and there has been contact between the parent, teacher and Principal, a child could be moved to another class in the following year. This action should take place only after discussions with the Principal / delegate and the involved parties.
- 5. In the event of new students altering the class structure or dynamics, some children may need to be moved to another class early in the school year.

Student enrolment numbers will be a major factor in determining class structures.

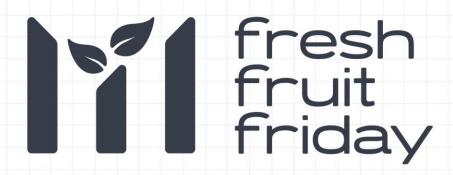
