Dear Parents, Carers and Greater Community,

Our Week 5 didn't run as planned with wet / unsettled weather forcing us to choose community safety and subsequently postponing our Melbourne Cup Family Fun Day. Whilst not a lot of rain ended up falling, the wind that started around 12:30pm was terrible, as was the cold... making it the right decision in the end.

MELBOURNE CUP FAMILY FUN DAY - MONDAY

As outlined above we had to postpone our Tuesday celebrations and have rescheduled for Monday, 10th November. This will mean the day will run exactly as planned with hats and fashions just after 9:00am in the undercover area, long distance races at 11:00am and picnic races to follow (11:45am – 1:00pm and 2:00pm – 3:00pm). Our P&F BBQ is running also... with orders closing tomorrow on Compass, though you should be able to buy on the day. A coffee van will also be present for you to purchase a hot drink... whilst our library will house a cup of tea/coffee for visitors for morning tea. An amazing Art Show will also be running in the Multipurpose Room on Monday (possibly on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday straight after school too!) – don't miss it, it's totally brilliant! Whilst some of you won't be able to come due to work, please rest assured we rescheduled to try and ensure the day had a chance of running for our students. Fingers crossed we have a better forecast for Monday.

Here's the rundown of the day from last week's newsletter in case you missed it: To make the day fun, we always have a PICNIC RACES DAY onsite. This includes hats and fashion competitions in the morning, competitive long-distance races mid-morning (before it gets hot) and shorter picnic style races like egg & spoon, sack races, three-legged races etc, focused around fun and inclusion — everyone can have a go! SOCIAL MEDIA & CYBER SAFETY

Navigating the Digital World: Your GPS for the Online Adventure

No Account, Mate! The Big Social Media Shake-Up for Under-16s

It's not just another headline to scroll past, this one's a real game-changer. In just over a month, Australia's giving the online world a bit of a shake-up. From December 10, anyone under 16 won't be able to have an account on the big social media platforms, think Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, TikTok, X, and YouTube. They'll still be able to *peek* at some publicly available content, but posting, commenting, and following their mates? That's off the table.

So, what's the big deal?

The old tick-a-box "Yep, I'm over 13" trick isn't going to cut it anymore. The government's decided that pop-up honesty tests aren't exactly keeping kids safe online (shock horror). Platforms now need proper age-assurance technology, not just good vibes and guesswork or they could be hit with whopping fines of up to \$50 million per breach.

It's part of a broader push to give Aussie kids a fair go when it comes to online safety. Because let's be real, the internet's not all dancing cockatoos and cute puppy clips. There's some pretty rough content out there, and the goal here is to help our young ones steer clear of the dodgy stuff until they're old enough to navigate it with a bit more street smarts.

What will actually change?

For kids under 16, creating new accounts on major platforms will be blocked. Existing accounts may be suspended or converted to limited viewing-only versions. So, your tween might still be able to watch a footy highlight reel on YouTube, but they won't be posting their own dance challenges on TikTok anytime soon.

Each platform's been told to sort out how they'll make it happen, meaning you might start seeing ID checks, parental verification steps, or new "family-safe" modes popping up before Christmas. And if companies don't comply? Well, the fines will hit harder than a magpie in swooping season.

What about the kids already online?

This is where it gets tricky. Many Aussie tweens already have social media accounts, often with a little creative truth-telling about their age. So, what happens to them now? Platforms will have to audit their users and take "reasonable steps" to remove or restrict under-age accounts. Some might ask for proof of age, while others could quietly deactivate accounts that look suspiciously young. It might feel like a pain, but it's a golden opportunity for families to have a proper chat about online life. What's safe? What's real? And why are these new rules coming in? After all, it's not about punishing kids, it's about protecting them from the nastier corners of the internet.

Why the sudden crackdown?

According to the eSafety Commissioner, Aussie children are being exposed to harmful content and predatory behaviour earlier than ever. Social media's fast pace, the constant pressure to post and compare, and those sneaky algorithms designed to keep us glued, it's a tough combo for young minds. This new law gives kids a bit more breathing room before they dive into the deep end of digital life. Think of it as giving them training wheels before the big ride.

What can parents do right now?

- Have the chat: Let your kids know what's coming and why.
- Do a quick account audit: Check what accounts exist and whether they're appropriate.
- Look into safety settings: Many platforms already have parental controls or "family modes."
- Stay in the loop: Follow updates from the eSafety Commissioner (<u>esafety.gov.au</u>) to keep on top of what's changing.
- Model good behaviour: Kids watch what we do, not just what we say. So maybe hold off on your own late-night scrolls through Marketplace while you're at it.

Final word

This isn't about wrapping kids in bubble wrap, it's about giving them a fair start. As parents, carers, and educators, we've got the chance to work hand-in-hand with the eSafety team to make sure our young Aussies are safe, savvy, and ready when their time online begins.

So, have a yarn around the dinner table, pour yourself a cuppa, and take a look at your family's digital habits. Social media will still be there when they're ready and by then, they'll be better equipped to tell the difference between a real mate and a red flag.

Because at the end of the day, we all want the same thing: our kids safe, smart, and still enjoying the sunshine outside, not just the glow of a screen.

And as a timely reminder, I got a taste of the new system myself just last night when Google asked me to verify my date of birth to check how old I am! Don't worry, I'm well and truly a dinosaur, so I don't think I'll be blocked from social media anytime soon. But it did make me chuckle and think, change really is on the way, and it's coming faster than you can say "just one more scroll."

Ouick details:

- Order by: 16th November (unfortunately, no orders can be accepted after this date)
- **How:** Order directly through the Uniform Portal please see the attached guide with the link and simple steps
- **School's role:** We do not process orders; everything is handled by the supplier

Sample tops are still available in the Senior Unit Teacher's office if you'd like to pop in before or after school to check sizing.

Recommendation: Many families choose to order two tops, as students wear them often. Having a spare is handy for washing cycles, and reorders can sometimes involve minimum order quantities and extra costs, so it's easier to decide now.

All the information you need, sizing, design, and ordering instructions, is included in the attached guide. If you need assistance, the supplier's contact details are also provided, and they're very helpful.
