Dear Parents, Carers and Greater Community,

As we head into the final two weeks of school, I am endeavouring to ensure the newsletter is full of information about what is occurring over the next two weeks. Hope this is helpful!

YEAR 6 GRADUATION - NEXT MONDAY, 8TH DECEMBER

It's wonderful to announce that our Year 6 Graduation is occurring NEXT Monday, 8th December from midday, with the weather forecast looking kind. Parents of graduates (and close family etc) are invited to attend but must bring a chair to sit on (a camp chair works well) as we will be outdoors in our assembly area. Also wear a hat in case you find yourself in a sunny spot and bring a drink bottle. After the awards ceremony concludes (around 12:45pm), families can head home whilst our Year 6 enjoy their Graduation lunch and then a disco during the last hour of the day. Families are reminded to order Graduation lunches on Compass before Friday, 5th December. Graduation Day is a normal day of school for Year 6; however, many children spend the morning at home getting ready for their graduation. If arriving late in preparation for the event, please ensure your child is signed in at the Office on arrival.

PLANNING WEEK - NEXT WEEK

To prepare for 2026 our teachers will spend one day next week, instead of having normal specialist programs, meeting and planning for 2026. On Wednesday Emma/Dean, Pauline, Wendy/Amanda, Nicole/Nick and Catherine's classes will have an alternate day with specialists or a CRT, on Thursday planning will then shift to Ainsley/Roberta and Jen's classes and finally on Friday planning will affect Brett, Kate and Jayden's classes. This information is to enable you to prepare your child for a different teacher or program on that day. Due to planning normal specialist times will not be in operation.

YEAR 1 - STAY AND PLAY... NEXT MONDAY AFTERNOON

On Monday afternoon our Year 1 students from Nicole, Jen and Jayden's room are invited to participate in the 2025 YEAR 1 STAY AND PLAY. When school dismisses at 3:15pm, our Year 1's stay onsite with their teachers for a bit of extra fun until 4:30pm. This is the first taste of staying beyond the school hours in preparation for the Year 2 Sleepover in 2026. Please consent on Compass so that your child is included. FINAL KINDERGARTEN / FOUNDATION VISIT ON TUESDAY

The final visit for our future Foundation students is next Tuesday, 9th December from 10:00am – 11:45am. During this visit our future students will be in their 2026 class with their 2026 teacher. Exciting times ahead! Information about next year will also be sent home with students to help families prepare for the big start in 2026.

STATEWIDE TRANSITION DAY - TUESDAY, 9TH DECEMBER

Our current Year 6's will head off to their State Secondary School on Tuesday for the day to participate in the Statewide Transition Day. The vast majority of our Year 6's will head to a Government Secondary School on Tuesday, however if your child is going to a Secondary School outside the Government / Public system, it's a normal day of schooling for them OR you may choose to make other arrangements. If doing so, please attend to absence notes via Compass. Year 6's will need to be transported to and from their Secondary School by their families.

STEP UP TRANSITION MORNING FOR YEARS 1 - 6 (2026) AND UPDATED CLASS STRUCTURES

Whilst our current Year 6's are at their Secondary School on Tuesday and our new Foundation students are onsite, the rest of the school will also transition, with children in current FOUNDATION to YEAR 5 students stepping up into their next Year Level and spending the morning with their 2026 classmates and teacher. We will run classes in the 2026 structure from 9:30am – 12:30pm, before returning students to their 2025 classrooms. To help prepare we have the following structure next year: FOUNDATION NICOLE / NICK and FOUNDATION CATHERINE, JUNIOR JEN and JUNIOR AINSLEY (Year 1/2), MIDDLE WENDY (Year 2/3), MIDDLE PAULINE and MIDDLE EMMA / DEAN (Year 3/4) and SENIOR KATE, SENIOR BRETT and SENIOR JAYDEN (all now Year 5/6's). Please note that we do not have to run a Year 4/5 class anymore.

At 6:00pm we will then have our students performing CHRISTMAS CAROLS / SONGS to end the night. This will run from 6:00pm-6:45pm. Children are to come dressed for the season. Those who don't celebrate Christmas are still encouraged to attend from 5:00pm-6:00pm, heading home after this time to avoid the carols. Whilst it is two weeks away, a bit of notice is helpful!

END OF TERM AWARDS AND YEAR 6 AVENUE OF HONOUR

On our final day of term we will present STUDENT AWARDS at a 9:00am assembly. Students from each class will be awarded in the following categories: EXCELLENCE IN ENGLISH, MATHEMATICS, VISUAL ART, PERFORMING ARTS and CHINESE, ENDEAVOUR IN ENGLISH and MATHEMATICS, OUTSTANDING DEMONSTRATION OF SCHOOL VALUES and THE PRINCIPALS AWARD. Winners will be announced in the final newsletter of the year enabling families to prepare to attend or not. Immediately after the awards, we will hold our YEAR 6 AVENUE OF HONOUR, where each Year 6 student will be announced individually and will parade down the avenue of staff and students to roaring cheers and high 5's. It's a special moment, so try not to miss it if you have a graduating student. We expect this to occur at approximately 9:30am.

YEAR 6 VERSES STAFF WATERFIGHT

On the final day of the school year our Year 6's may come prepared for a water fight. Select staff will participate and send off our Year 6's with a bit of fun. We ask Year 6 families to ensure children bring only super soakers, water pistols or buckets. No water bombs please! Only Year 6 students will participate with the rest of the school watching from a vantage point. It's important to speak to your child about them only wetting staff involved in the water fight and other Year 6's. If you do not want your child to participate, they do not have to. On Friday, 19th December we finish for the year at 1:30pm. This is in line with other schools in our area and this earlier dismissal is only allowed on the final day of the school year. Due to the 1:30pm dismissal, families will need to adjust and ensure their child/ren are picked up earlier or are booked into OSHC (contact TheirCare). The Ravenswood bus will run at this earlier time, with families asked to pick up in line with this dismissal from bus stops. At this stage I cannot confirm if the Kangaroo Flat bus will run or not. Navigating the Digital World: Your GPS for the Online Adventure

Our Kidlets: More Adaptable Than We Think

If there's one thing grown-ups consistently underestimate, it's the sheer adaptability of our tweens and teens. These little legends are more flexible than a gymnast at the Commonwealth Games, and quicker to move on than a rat off a sinking ship. The moment you think you've wrapped your head around the platforms they're using BAM! They've already migrated somewhere else.

While our eSafety Commissioner has been working overtime, flat out like a lizard drinking, trying to roll out the under-16 social media bans to protect kids from cyberbullying, grooming, and the general rubbish floating around online... the children have already side-stepped and found new digital playgrounds.

Of course they have.

They're built for this.

The "Alternative" Platforms Causing Havoc

Just this week, we've seen more schoolyard tension tied to **Discord** and **Roblox chats** than from any of the big social media names. Even though these apps aren't technically labelled as "social media," the chat functions make them just as tricky.

Kids will tell you they're "just playing a game," but the moment someone:

- blocks someone
- kicks someone from a server
- changes a group name
- or "accidentally" says something snarky in the chat

... it becomes the talk of the classroom faster than you can say "Who ate my BBQ Shapes?"

Some of these chat dramas would put *Neighbours* and *Home and Away* combined to shame, and yes, they will absolutely retell every detail with the intensity of a royal commission.

Why the eSafety Mob Brought in the Ban

The social media restrictions coming in are not about being the fun-police.

They're about:

- reducing cyberbullying
- stopping random online strangers from chatting with kids
- keeping adult content out of young eyes
- protecting kids' data
- forcing platforms to PROVE age, not just accept "Yeah mate, I'm totally 16" typed by someone who still collects Pokémon cards

It's all about creating a safer digital environment, something all parents, carers, and educators can get behind.

The Problem? Kids Are Digital Houdinis

Give any kid just one rule and watch them find three different loopholes before breakfast.

Discord? Safe.

Roblox? Totally fine.

A random chat function hidden inside a cooking game that nobody over the age of 12 has ever heard of? Even better. They don't see themselves as "breaking rules." They're just being... well... kids. Curious, chatty, and desperate to stay connected to their mates.

What Adults Can Do (Besides a Deep, Dramatic Sigh!)

Until the tech, the law, and the platform developers catch up, our best defences are the low-tech, old-fashioned ones:

- Talk to them, often. Ask what they're playing. Ask who they're talking to.
- Keep devices visible, not sneaky under blankets or stuffed inside hoodies.
- Set boundaries that make sense, not punishmentstyle lockdowns that kids will immediately try to wiggle out of.
- Normalise coming to you when things feel dodgy or uncomfortable online.
- **Stay curious**, even when their descriptions make about as much sense as a magpie with a GPS.

A Final Thought

Our kidlets are clever, adaptable, social little beings. They're not trying to be sneaky villains; they're just growing up in a world where digital connections are as normal as riding a bike.

The bans will help, absolutely!

But real safety is built through conversations, relationships, and keeping the door wide open for chats when things get weird online. Because at the end of the day, no matter how many apps get banned, blocked, patched, age-verified, or made "kid-safe," nothing beats a grown-up who's present, listening, and willing to jump into the digital deep end with them.

Safe travels on the internet highway, where your data's the passenger, and you're the navigator!
