### END OF TERM AWARDS AND YEAR 6 AVENUE OF HONOUR - repeat

On our final day of term we will present STUDENT AWARDS at a 9:00am assembly. Students from each class will be awarded in the following categories: EXCELLENCE IN ENGLISH, MATHEMATICS, VISUAL ART, PERFORMING ARTS and CHINESE, ENDEAVOUR IN ENGLISH and MATHEMATICS, OUTSTANDING DEMONSTRATION OF SCHOOL VALUES and THE PRINCIPALS AWARD. # Navigating the Digital World: Your GPS for the Online Adventure

## Everybody, Pause Before You Post!

We worry about teens uploading too much, but many adults are out here:

- posting photos of the new decking, complete with street views
- sharing their holiday dates while the house sits empty
- uploading beach pics with the kids' school hats clearly visible
- tagging the exact cafe they are in, at that exact moment
- and giving scammers an entire biography without even realising

Honestly, if strangers wanted to work out where half of us live, all they would need is a quiet afternoon and our Facebook profiles.

We cannot point the finger at young people when we are practically offering up a digital treasure map with our own posts.

And Look, I Know I Have Said It Before...

But it is still the truest line in the cyber safety world: If something feels too good to be true, it probably is.

Adults fall for scams too, sometimes even faster than the kids. The free caravan giveaway, the unbelievable Black Friday deal, the surprise message from a long-lost friend whose account was obviously hacked, we have all seen them. Half of us have clicked on them.

We lecture teens about online traps while falling straight into the digital ditches ourselves.

What Are We Really Sharing with the World?

Before we post anything, it is worth asking:

- Does this show where I live or where I am going to be?
- Does this reveal my child's school, sport or weekly routine?
- Are my pet's names in this post, and also my passwords?
- Would I be comfortable with my teen posting this much?

If the answer makes you squirm even a little, maybe hit save instead of share.

# We Set the Tone, Whether We Mean to or Not

Kids model what they see.

If adults post everything online, the good, the bad, the burnt snags from Bunnings, then kids learn that is normal. But if we show them, it is okay to keep some things private, to think before sharing, to protect their personal information, that sticks too. And with the new under 16 restrictions kicking in, the pressure eases off kids just a smidge and shifts quietly onto us.

### Reality Check!

We love a yarn. We love sharing the wins, the laughs, the holidays and the classic moments, kookaburras on the fence, kids covered in mud after backyard cricket, sunsets over the beach and that photo of Uncle Kev asleep in the camping chair again. But the online world is not like the backyard or the footy club.

### It is bigger! It is permanent! And, it is not always friendly!

Oversharing might feel harmless, but sometimes it leaves cracks for scammers, creeps and unwanted eyes.

### Final Thought

As the new social media rules for teens and tweens come into play, maybe it is time we do our own digital spring clean. The kids are not the only ones navigating this online maze, we are right there with them.

So, while the naughty elves are lurking in lounge rooms and the kids are buzzing with holiday energy, take a quiet moment for yourself.

Have a look at what your posts are revealing.

Ask what you are sharing.

Think about who might be seeing it.

Pause before you post, not just for your own safety, but to model the kind of digital habits we want our kids to grow up with.

Safe travels on the internet highway, where your data's the passenger, and you're the navigator!
