Dear Parents, Carers and Greater Community,

Our Term 1 launch for the 2026 school year is almost complete with only a week (or less than) to go! We have quite a lot happening in the final days, so please have a read through the newsletter to be prepared for what's ahead in the coming days.

PIZZA DAY TOMORROW – NO NORMAL CANTEEN & LAST CANTEEN DAY FOR TERM 1

Just a reminder that our Pizza Day is tomorrow instead of canteen. Families were given up until today to order for tomorrow, instead of ordering canteen. If you have missed ordering, you are welcome to drop in a hot lunch for your child at 1:30pm or send them along with a packed lunch / treat instead. Iced treats are still available.

STAFFING

We welcomed Wendy back into her class on Tuesday and thank Amanda for working the extra days up until Monday. Roberta has been away a few days this week and has been covered by Aime. We have also had lots of Casual Relief Teachers working to support planning during Week 9. Bec Trembath, Education Support, has been away sick this week too... and we have welcomed Jaci Rutter to the school to cover some of Bec's work and also support whilst Amy Mountjoy is away on teaching rounds.

CCTV CAMERAS NOW ON SITE

After multiple issues in the school grounds with criminal behaviour resulting in damage to buildings and theft, we were fortunate enough to get a grant to install CCTV Cameras on the school grounds. These face main entries and areas of the school and record 24 hours a day. Due to this we have placed our CCTV PRIVACY NOTICE on our website and available from the Office. The cameras will prevent, support and verify incidents involving criminal behaviour of anyone on school grounds, capture inappropriate behaviour – including students, staff, visitors or members of the public, verify and investigate incidents involving students, staff or visitors and provide our Department with visual coverage during emergencies. The CCTV cameras are not located in private areas such as toilets, changing rooms etc, are not used to monitor student or staff performance, nor are they hidden or covertly placed. The cameras will be a great addition to our school to protect our students, staff, community and our valuable assets.

ATTENDANCE

We have just updated our Attendance Policy which is now live on our webpage. Please remember if your child is away, you need to contact the school to advise. Children should be at school every day unless there is a valid reason. If you do not let us know why your child is away, we are legally required to contact you by COMPASS message, text or phone call. Please work with us by advising early in the day if your child is away. Thank you.

PUNCTUALITY – ARRIVE AT SCHOOL BY 9:00AM

Please have your child at school each day by 9:00am. This is important, so they don't miss the literacy block or interrupt classes when entering late. Of course, we understand those times where families have had an appointment first or a drama making them later than normal.

END OF TERM OUT OF UNIFORM

Our SRC have met and have decided that the last day of term is out of uniform, with students encouraged to bring a donation for the ROYAL CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL GOOD FRIDAY APPEAL. If your child would like to come out of uniform next Thursday, 2nd April, please remember that they should be SunSmart (this includes covered shoulder tops/dresses and enclosed toe shoes) and will need a monetary donation for the RCH.

EVACUATION DRILL TOMORROW

We have a scheduled Evacuation Drill tomorrow where classes and staff will practice doing our Evacuation to the Tiger Turf. This enables us to train the children in what to do in an emergency – so they aren't as stressed or unsure when the real thing happens. Please talk at home tonight about the EVACUATION DRILL so they are prepared – knowing it's not real and just a practice run 😊.

CROSS COUNTRY SELECTION TOMORROW

Our Middle Unit and Senior Unit classes will have their Big Hill PS Cross Country selections tomorrow morning on arrival. Please send your child to school with the appropriate footwear tomorrow. Also advise us if they are unable to participate in writing (or calling) rather than keeping them at home to avoid. Selection will only take a small part of the day and no one is expected to do more than they are capable or comfortable of doing.

SCHOOL COUNCIL MEMBERS

Our School Council met for the first time with our current members, with our AGM occurring and resulting in new office bearers being elected. Congratulations to our new SCHOOL COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Candy Haines, VICE SCHOOL COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Steve Penno, TREASURER: Aaron Fuller and SECRETARY: Pauline Mulcair.

EASTER RAFFLE AND COMPETITIONS

Don't forget our wonderful raffle and competitions underway. Please try and sell your tickets and return them with the funds by the last week of school. Extra books are available. Don't forget there is a GUESS THE EGGS IN THE JAR and COLOURING COMPETITION (Toddler, Foundation, Junior Unit, Middle Unit, Senior Unit and Parent / Carer) running for 50c in our Office. A big thank you to families who have sold tickets, donated goods for prizes and have supported the competitions. It's a bit of Easter fun and fundraising for our kids.

EASTER HAT PARADE

We have an Easter Hat Parade happening on Thursday, 2nd April at 9:00am. All children are encouraged to come to school with **Easter Themed** hats (or another themed hat of your child's choice if Easter is not celebrated). We will have each class do a couple of laps of the undercover area, with judges selected to choose finalists... and awards presented to the winners in each class. This is also the last day of Term 1 and a fun way to finish, so why not get behind our first EASTER HAT PARADE by helping your child prepare. There's no need to go to a lot of trouble – it's all in the name of fun... so please don't feel you have to spend hours on the construction.

SCHOOL PHOTO DAY – NEXT MONDAY

Our annual school photo day is next Monday, 30th March – with MSP PHOTOGRAPHY visiting to take individual photos, class photos, and family photos (if requested and ordered). Information about ordering is on Compass to help you prepare for the big day. Ensure your child is at school on time Monday, ready to roll. Please note that our Office will close for a 15 minute period just before school starts to enable us to take our STAFF PHOTO (8:40am).

NO ASSEMBLY MONDAY

Due to school photos, we will not hold a whole school assembly in the morning on Monday. We also have a whole school assembly on Thursday anyway! Awards will still be presented, but over the PA and photos of winners taken in our library and posted to COMPASS / FACEBOOK. If you would like your child's photos to be shared, please attend to photo permissions on COMPASS. Contact the Office if you need help.

STUDENT AWARDS

Our end of Term is always a time of celebration, occurring next Thursday, 2nd April straight after our EASTER HAT PARADE (around 9:30am). Awards presented include THE ENGLISH AWARD and THE MATHEMATICS AWARD – presented to a student for either showing great growth in one of these areas or excelling. OUTSTANDING DEMONSTRATION OF SCHOOL VALUES will remain, and we have introduced a SPECIALIST AWARD for each room with one of our specialist teachers choosing a winner from each class for excellent work in their area of study. In an EARLY NEWSLETTER ON WEDNESDAY next week, we will advise our winners in advance so families can endeavour to make the final assembly to see their child presented!

TERM 2 ASSEMBLIES – FRIDAYS

Don't forget that we are going to trial doing our assembly of a Friday afternoon, instead of Monday mornings in Term 2. There's a couple of reasons for this, namely the interruption to the literacy block of a Monday, anxiety for many students with the start of the week and a big gathering first off and changing weather conditions – Friday afternoons will be milder in Term 2 😊. More information will come, but at this stage expect a Friday assembly commencing at 2:55pm in the undercover area when we return in Term 2. Assemblies will run until the end of the day, with students dismissed by teachers for the weekend directly from assembly.

DOING IT TOUGH?

If your family is doing it tough and groceries, school lunches and snacks are becoming more difficult to purchase, please reach out to me via email: Matthew.Pearce@education.vic.gov.au and I'll discreetly organise a bag of goodies to support. This includes long life milk, cereal, tuna and rice, tinned fruit, popcorn, vegemite, spaghetti, baked beans etc. If you have already received some groceries but need more... please just email me, I'm happy to help.

I know it can be hard to ask for help, but rest assured your request will be dealt with discreetly and privately. Remember too – you aren't alone... and lots of families are struggling.

Also don't forget that we run a breakfast club every day for all students. This runs each morning from 8:40am – 8:55am – so send them to us and we will ensure they have plenty to eat. We even have fresh fruit baskets in class and our foyer for children to help themselves.

EARLY DISMISSAL – THURSDAY, 2ND APRIL

The school holidays commence next Thursday, 2nd April, with school dismissing at 2:30pm in line with schools across the region. For Foundation families this might be a new experience, so advising our new members of the community that in Victoria all schools dismiss an hour earlier on the last day of a term leading into the holidays, except the last day of the school year where we dismiss at 1:30pm. Next Thursday please adjust your pickup times to 2:30pm as a result of the early dismissal or book your child into OSHC by contacting THEIR CARE if you cannot arrive earlier. Our Ravenswood and Kangaroo Flat Bus will run at this earlier time also – so please adjust your pickup times from bus stops to ensure your child is not left waiting alone. Parents should note that dismissal is at 2:30pm and children must be picked up by 2:45pm when our duty teachers leave the yard. Our Office will also close at 3:00pm, so please make contact before this time if you require anything.

Navigating the Digital World: Your GPS for the Online Adventure Online Kindness... or Just More Drama?

Scrolling online can feel a bit like walking into the schoolyard at recess. One minute everything's fine, the next there's drama in the comments, someone's been "cancelled", and suddenly everyone's an expert with something to say.

We hear a lot about being kind online. In fact, you'd think with the amount of "be kind" posts floating around, the internet would be the nicest place on earth. Spoiler alert... it's not! So what's going on?

Part of the problem is that being online makes it easy to forget there's a real person on the other side of the screen. It's a lot simpler to fire off a quick comment when you're not standing face to face with someone. No awkward silence. No teacher giving you the look. No immediate consequences.

And then there's the pile on effect. One person says something negative, another joins in, and before you know it, it's less about the original post and more about who can come up with the harshest reply. Not exactly the kindness we keep hearing about.

But here's the thing. Kindness online isn't about posting a quote or liking a "spread positivity" meme. It's what you actually do in the moment. It's choosing not to join in when someone's being targeted. It's thinking twice before hitting send. It's backing someone up when others are tearing them down.

It also doesn't mean you have to agree with everyone. You can disagree without being disrespectful. Big difference.

And let's be honest, a lot of online drama isn't even worth the energy. Half the time it's about something small that's been blown up way out of proportion. A misunderstanding turns into an argument, which turns into a full blown comment war. Suddenly people who weren't even involved are jumping in like it's the grand final.

Stepping away is underrated. Not every comment needs a response. Not every situation needs you to jump in and "set things straight". Sometimes the smartest move is to scroll on and get on with your day.

At the end of the day, the internet is what people make it. If everyone adds a bit more negativity, that's what it becomes. But if more people choose to be decent humans, even when it's not the popular option, things start to shift.

No big speech needed. No dramatic posts about kindness. Just small choices, every day.

And maybe... just maybe... a little less drama in the group chat wouldn't hurt either.

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Big Hill PS is excited to be taking part! Login details for the Premiers' Reading Challenge will be sent home with students this week. Please keep these details in a safe place so your child can log their reading and take part in the challenge. The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 and aims to help young readers develop a lifelong love of reading. It is not a competition; it is a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 4 September 2026.

Children from Foundation to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to 10 are challenged to read 15 books. All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.


